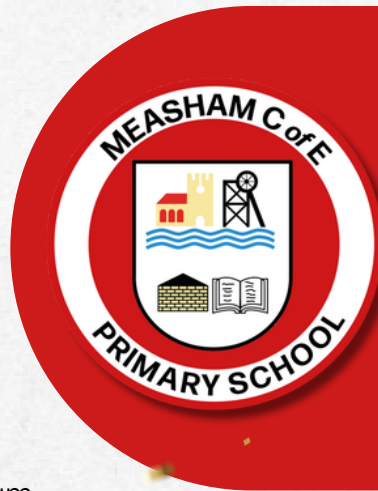

Some of our children joined the parish council last week to help plant flowers in the new pots at Bosworth Park. The children had a wonderful time—thank you for the invitation!

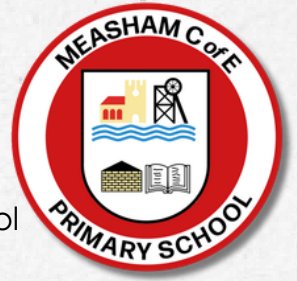

News from the Classes



Reception & Pre-School

EYFS have had a nice week. We have enjoyed some foot spas to keep us cool from the heat as well as many ice pops! We have enjoyed a little outdoor play, building sandcastles and looking and pouring and filling in the water area.



Year 1 - Rabbits

This week, the Rabbits have been busy making smoothies! We began by tasting a variety of smoothies, discussing their texture, colour and taste, and then ranking our favourites. The children then worked collaboratively in groups to create their own smoothie recipes, showing great teamwork and creativity.

Later in the week, the children had the opportunity to make their smoothies, practising important skills such as peeling, chopping and grating. They thoroughly enjoyed tasting their finished creations!

The children were incredibly sensible throughout and remained fully engaged in all activities—well done, Rabbits!



Year 2 - Badgers

Year 2 have had a wonderfully busy few weeks, bursting with energy and curiosity. We've been diving into setting descriptions, exploring how writers bring places to life, and everyone is excited to write their own next week. In our wider curriculum, the class have been fascinated by the Great Space Race, learning about the competition, the astronauts, and the incredible achievements that shaped space exploration. And of course, if you hadn't noticed, it's been hot hot hot — but Year 2 have taken it in stride, finding fun and creative ways to keep cool in class while still working hard and enjoying their learning.



News from the Classes

Year 3 - Moles

Moles class have had an amazing time finishing our Science project all about Plants and it has been great to see photographs of the sunflowers that the children took home a few weeks ago. In the lovely sunshine we are beginning our unit on Ancient Greece, it certainly feels that we are there!

Year 4 -Squirrels

The last two weeks have been very busy in Squirrels Class! We were excited to welcome a visitor from the solar farm, who helped prepare us for our trip the following day. During this visit, we learned all about how solar energy is produced and why it is an important renewable resource. In English, we have been developing our biography writing skills and have recently begun writing about the life and achievements of David Attenborough.

In Maths, we have been focusing on position and direction, practising how to plot coordinates accurately on a grid.

Our Art lessons have explored the theme of light, with a particular focus on mosaic art. Although we initially found working with small tiles quite challenging, we have shown great perseverance and have created some fantastic compositions.

Well done, Squirrels Class, for all your hard work!

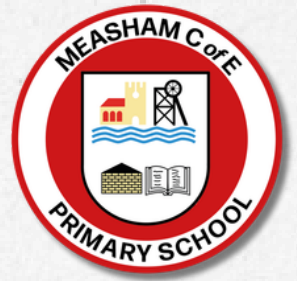
Year 5 - Owls

It has been a very challenging week, weatherwise, but Year 5 have demonstrated resilience towards changes to lessons and routines. Well done! Assessment week has coincided with the warm weather, but we have had good focus. In maths, we've moved on from negative numbers into measurement and units. In English, we've been working on the features of recall writing and there's been some solid work coming through. We also finished our science topic on growth in animals and humans, which rounded off nicely. We will be moving onto DT and bread making soon. As the end of term approaches, most children are getting well prepared for year 6 and they should be proud of the progress that they have made.

Year 6 - Foxes

SATS might be over. Writing moderation might be over. The countdown to Secondary School has begun. However, Year 6 haven't faltered. We are deep into our Rise Charter project of 'Make £5 Grow'; delving into the understanding of entrepreneurship, market research and branding. We have also started another project called 'Anywhere Island': a chance to combine many of our subjects together as we discover an island, describe it, explore it's wildlife and advertise it. Sports day was a great success (surprisingly cooler than last year), and Year 6s showed great responsibility in looking after their teams throughout the morning. And how could we forget the production? Children are embracing the 'I'm a celeb' style concept and things are starting to come together.

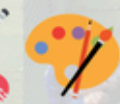
